Dear Parents and Carers,

As the summer term draws to a close I reflect back on what again has been a difficult term and year for all our community particularly with regard to school closures. However, our community certainly rose to the challenge and I thank you again for your support.

On a more positive note, during this year and directly this term, we have seen the return of school trips from France and Belgium, London and around the country in the Tall Ships Expedition. We once again can welcome this wider experience to school life, that was lost during the Covid pandemic and we look forward to further trips that are planned for the next academic year.

In addition, numerous experiences here within school have also enriched all that have been involved. The school production of Frozen, the Art Exhibition and the reintroduction of bands nights. All of these events supplement and enrich our school experience and offer opportunities that in recent years we were unable to provide due to Covid restrictions.

In recent weeks we welcomed our future Year 6 students to a creative and activity led day that gave them all a flavour of what Gateacre School offers to those lucky 255 students who have managed to secure a place here in September. Gateacre School is now one of the most first preference schools across Liverpool with a growing waiting list and increasing number of appeals from parents/carers to gain a place. This is a position this school has not been in for some time and it is down to several factors: the dedicated, hard work of staff, the recognition from parent and carers of these efforts and the guided support from our 42 different primary schools across the City. May I thank you all for placing us in this wonderful position.

With that in mind, we are now reintroducing, from September, the 'Home School Agreement' that was in place before the Covid pandemic. This will be sent out to you via Edulink-One and it is available for you to sign now and will close on the 8th September, then click on the link below.

Part of the Home School Agreement is attendance. School attendance will become statutory from September 2023 and as always is our whole school priority. Attendance will be scrutinised, both at local authority level and at national level for all schools in England. As part of the drive to improve school attendance, Gateacre School has employed its first Attendance Officer.















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Mrs McIntyre will contact you if we feel that your son/daughter's attendance is not where is should be or if we feel that it may become a concern in the near future.

Prior to Christmas I wrote to you regarding changes to the length of the school week. Gateacre School does not currently operate a 32.5-hour week. In order to meet this requirement from Monday 4th September, Gateacre School will increase the length of the school day from 3:05 to 3:20.

As the number of young people attending Gateacre School has increased during the year and will continue to do so from September 2023, I am mindful of how we as a growing community communicate effectively with each other. Access to school and school staff is a priority for us all, however, I am aware that with this growing number of young people places pressures on school colleagues for responses that on occasions are unachievable. Therefore, I am sharing with you the communication guidelines that Gateacre School will operate from September.

- The School Reception is staffed between the core hours of 8.00am -4.30pm. Outside and within these hours there is a facility to email the school on admin@gateacre.org
- Phone calls will be returned within 2 working days of parents/carers call.
- Replies to emails will be returned within 2 working days of receipt.
- Acknowledgement of a written letter will be within 2 working days of receipt.
- Communication sent at weekends will not be dealt with until the following working week.
- Emails sent during holidays will receive no reply until term-time.















On occasions when teaching colleagues have been unable to communicate with yourselves during the working day, due to their teaching commitment, some of our community, albeit a very small minority, have communicated with school colleagues in an unprofessional and unpleasant manner resorting to abusive and rude language and behaviour. This is not acceptable and on occasions such as those, should not ever occur. The Parent Code of Conduct identifies the procedure.

Earlier in June many of you received unauthorised communication from school in the form of messages regarding the addition of behaviour points, detentions and the setting up of extracurricular activities in the form of clubs. At the time I informed you of what the school did in response to those; informing the necessary authorities including the Local Authority, Police and the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). After consideration of the case the ICO felt that they did not need to take any formal regulatory action due to the nature and seriousness of the breach and the action taken by the school at that time. I can confirm police investigation has concluded and the necessary actions have been taken.

As the return to school will come very quickly, may I take this opportunity to give you details for September.
