Reporting an Absence: What You Need to Know

If your child is unwell or unable to attend, please let us know as early as possible so we can ensure they are safe.

- **The Deadline:** Please report all absences by 8:45 AM.
- **Option 1 (Best):** Use the Edulink One App. It's fast, secure, and the most efficient way to update us.
- **Option 2:** Call our Pastoral Administration Team on 0151 363 1111.

For frequent or long-term illness, we may request medical evidence to authorise the absence.

Our Commitment to Safety

If a student is absent and we haven't heard from you, we treat this as a safeguarding priority.

To ensure your child is safe, our team may conduct a same-day home visit or contact external agencies if we cannot reach you. Communication is key to avoiding these steps!

The day provided a real taste of the "High Achiever" experience, beginning with a sample lecture on Law that challenged students to think like undergraduates.

This was followed by a fascinating interactive seminar on contemporary research into **Dangerous Dogs and Dog Bites**, allowing our students to engage with real-world social and legal issues.

Beyond the classroom, the group explored the main university campus and attended a bespoke workshop on **UCAS applications**,



gaining vital advice on how to navigate the transition to university life and stand out in their personal statements.

This was an invaluable opportunity for our students to explore exciting career pathways and envision themselves in a higher education setting. As always, our students were impeccable ambassadors for Gateacre School.

Their conduct and engagement were so impressive that the university has extended a **standing invitation** for our students to attend all future events run by the School of Law & Social Justice.

Inclusion at Gateacre School: Supporting Every Student to Succeed

At Gateacre School, inclusion is at the heart of everything we do. It shapes how we teach and how we build a calm, respectful culture where every child feels they belong, feels safe, and is supported to make strong progress. We hold high expectations for all our students, and we are clear that **SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) is never a barrier to ambition**. Instead, it is a call for us to work harder as a school community - removing obstacles, strengthening our teaching, and providing the right support so every student can experience success.

Creating the Right Environment

Inclusion at Gateacre is visible in our day-to-day routines. We know that many students thrive when they know what to expect, so our classrooms are calm and purposeful with consistent lesson structures.

This predictability helps students feel secure and ready to learn. Our staff use practical strategies to keep students engaged, breaking down complex tasks into manageable steps so that everyone can approach challenging subjects with confidence.

Celebrating External Recognition

We recently welcomed an external SEND Consultant to review our progress, and their feedback was incredibly encouraging. They highlighted several key strengths:

- **Consistency:** Our uniform lesson structures across the school help reduce anxiety for students who rely on routine.
- **Practical Tools:** The use of visual timers, "visualisers," and specially designed worksheets was praised for helping students with SEND access learning more independently.
- **Expert Support:** Our intervention specialists were recognised for their focused sessions that target individual student needs.

Most importantly, the review found that in every lesson observed, students with additional needs were actively learning alongside their peers. This reflects our deep commitment to making sure the right adjustments are made within the mainstream classroom.

The Student Voice

Our students' experience matters most. In recent feedback, students shared that they enjoy coming to school and feel well-supported in their lessons. When children feel safe and valued, they are more likely to attend regularly and achieve their very best.

Looking Ahead: A Partnership with Families


Inclusion is not just a school initiative; it is a promise. Moving forward, we will continue to refine our support systems and develop our staff's expertise.

Curriculum Spotlight: Latin & Classics

Following the recent curriculum and assessment review by Professor Becky Francis, the national educational landscape is shifting.

The review highlights a vital truth: schools must have the flexibility to innovate and go beyond the "aspirational entitlement" of the national curriculum to meet local needs.

At Gateacre School, we have long championed this vision. We believe our students deserve a curriculum that is not only academic and demanding but also reflective of the excellence they are capable of - irrespective of their background.

Breaking the "Privilege" Barrier

This year, we are proud to have broadened our horizons with the formal introduction of **Latin and Classics at Key Stage 3**.

For generations, a classical education was often viewed as a preserve of the few. However, a modern revival is underway in the nation's leading state schools.

Research consistently shows that classical subjects:

- **Raise Aspirations:** Connecting students to the foundations of Western thought.

- **Boost Literacy:** Providing a rigorous, structured approach to grammar and vocabulary.
- **Enhance Language Skills:** Building a powerful foundation for learning Modern Foreign Languages.

Levelling the Playing Field

Beyond the classroom, a qualification in Latin or Classical Civilisation is a powerful asset.

It allows our students to compete on equal footing with peers from private and grammar school backgrounds when applying for elite universities and competitive professions.

Yet, the benefits are immediate. Latin and Classics have quickly become our most inclusive subjects. Because every student begins their journey at the exact same starting point, prior attainment is no barrier to success.

As our students engage with the timeless tales of gods and goddesses, senates and soldiers, they are doing more than reading history - they are building the cultural capital and critical thinking skills that will improve their life chances for years to come.
