On Wednesday **2nd July**, we were thrilled to welcome 240 Year 6 students from over 40 different primary schools for our annual Transition Day! Designed to give them a vibrant taste of secondary school life, the day was packed with opportunities. Students met their new teachers and peers, experienced four engaging lessons, and enjoyed our exciting new lunchtime menu. They also began to familiarise themselves with our daily routines, including assembly, morning line-up, moving between lessons, and form time.

The day kicked off with an inspiring assembly from our Principal, Mr. Jamil, who focused on three core messages: **work hard, try your best, and be respectful.** Students were then introduced to their Year 7 pastoral team, including form teachers and Pastoral Leader Mr. Backhouse, before practising their morning routine in their new forms.

Lesson highlights included:

- Geography: Teamwork to respond to a tectonic hazard, creating a hazard risk map.
- History: Investigating who was truly to blame for the sinking of the 'unsinkable' Titanic.
- Science: Creating animal labels, explaining features for survival in chosen environments.
- Spanish: Exploring vibrant Spanish festivals and cultural traditions like La Tomatina.

Lunchtime was a hit, with many students complementing our delicious new menu and thanking our kitchen staff. A special thank you goes to our fantastic Year 7 and Year 12 student leaders, who demonstrated true excellence and teamwork by guiding and supporting our Year 6 visitors throughout the day.

Looking ahead, we will welcome students back for CATs, and our transition teams continue primary school visits. We are also excited to host over 100 students at our Transition Summer School during the holidays – full details have been sent via EduLink to all who expressed interest.

You Said, We Did!

- You Said: You wanted a single platform for homework communication, with clear details and deadlines.
- We Did: From September 2025, we will introduce a dedicated homework function on EduLink. All staff will record homework details here, making it easy for pupils and parents to view tasks, deadlines, and instructions.
- You Said: Many pupils wanted to complete homework at school with support and IT access; parents agreed.
- We Did: We are expanding our Homework Club provision. From September, after-school Homework Clubs will be available every evening, offering pupils access to IT facilities and a quiet, supportive environment.
- You Said: You want students to be recognised and rewarded for their hard work.
- We Did: From September, students will earn an achievement point for every completed piece of homework. These points will accumulate towards reward milestones and exciting school celebrations.
- You Said: While homework is valued, 70% were unsatisfied with the current quality and quantity.
- We Did: From September 2025, we will introduce a homework timetable. This weekly guide will outline tasks and allocated time from subject areas. Core subjects (Maths, English, Science) will have a carefully selected weekly task, with other subjects alternating within the schedule.
