Refine

You are assessed on your ability to: refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

This means that you need to try lots of different ideas, even if they don't work out this is the bit where you get marks if you make mistakes! Just make sure those mistakes inform what you do next.



Annotation - written response to artist work or style, can include your own personal response

Presentation - the way in which you present your piece of creative work for viewing.

Final Piece - a selection of work that is created as a response to the initial theme given.

Development - the process of developing ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

Understanding - using your knowledge and comprehension of an artists' work to create your own.

Process - process refers to the steps undertaken to achieve something.
